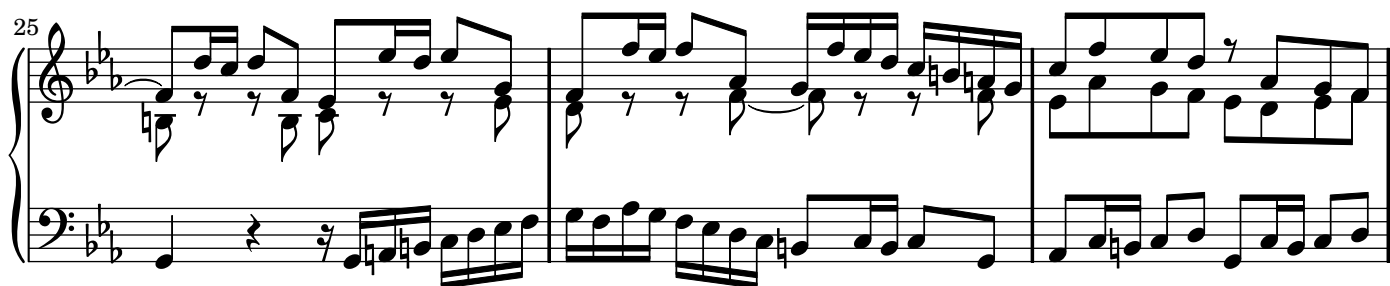
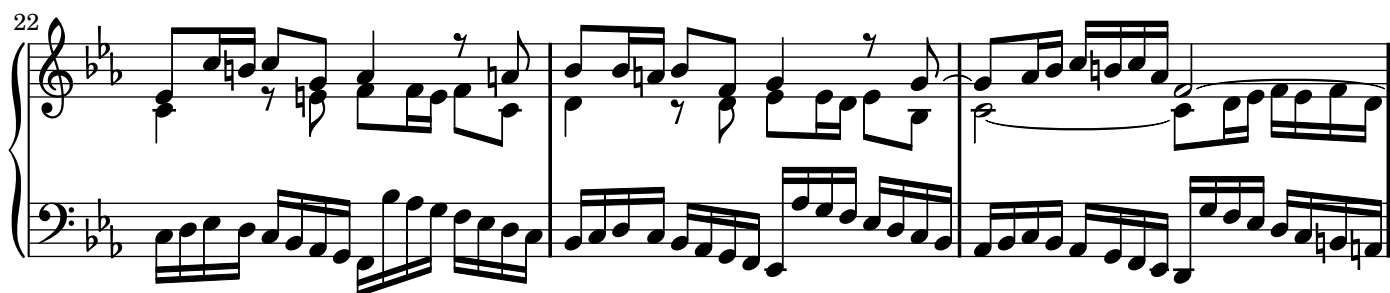
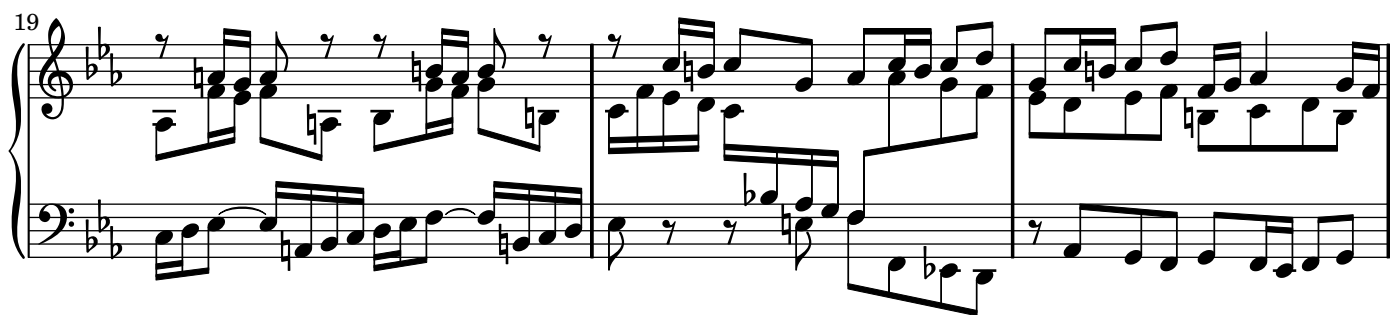


# Fuga a 3 voci
